There will be an Ecumenical Service at St. David's Cathedral, Murray Street, Hobart at 11.00am on Friday, 2 February 2024.

The Registrar will be responsible for ensuring that these arrangements are carried out. The Chief Justice would be obliged if the profession would carry out the Registrar's instructions. There are no parking facilities available in the grounds of the Cathedral.

4. CLERKS, PARTNERS AND FRIENDS

Persons not in the procession will be directed to pews by ushers supplied by Chambers. They should be seated before the procession enters the Cathedral.

5. HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR

Her Excellency the Governor and her party will arrive at the Murray Street entrance at 10.59am and will be met by the Dean and conducted into the Cathedral.

6. SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

These will be in accordance with the attached Appendix.

7. DEPARTURE FROM THE CATHEDRAL

Her Excellency and her party will be escorted to the Main Door by the Dean followed by clergy, Chief Justice Blow, Judges, Acting Judges, Associate Judge and associates. Otherwise there will be no retiring procession.

8. SPEAKER TO ADDRESS CONGREGATION

The speaker addressing the congregation is Max Jeganathan. Mr Jeganathan is a Senior Research Fellow at the Centre for Public Christianity, a former lawyer and political and policy adviser who was educated at the Australian National University and the University of Oxford.
